Topic	Discussion/Conclusion	Action/ Follow up
Welcome/ Prayer	 Lorin welcomed everyone to the 2022 Annual Meeting and announced that 27 members were present and we had a quorum to proceed. He then went over the agenda for the meeting. Pastor Taylor led us in reading together the DeerGrove Relational Covenant. Lorin opened the meeting in prayer. 	Tonow up
Approvals	 Minutes from last year's meeting: Lorin made a motion to accept the 2021 Annual Meeting Notes. Mark De La Paz seconded the motion, and the minutes were accepted. 	
Chair Report (Lorin Michael)	 Lorin shared his reflections on 2022 with many highlights and photos from the year. He thanked individuals and teams for using their time and talents in many ways. Membership report: membership decreased from 56 to 52 individuals. Average attendance was 51 people. Peak attendance dates included 98 for the child dedication and 82 for the Christmas Eve Eve service. Question: Someone asked if there is any way to track online watchers. Lorin answered that there are typically 5-6 people watching live per week. We aren't sure about those who may watch the service later. 	

Ministry Staff Reports

Pastor Taylor Sexton

- Pastor Taylor thanked Lorin for all he does as chair and beyond, as well as Donna.
- He read Philippians 1:3-6 and reflected on the past year; he asked the congregation to think of one word that comes to mind regarding DeerGrove. Words that were shared include: transition, faithful, community, steadfast, support, engage, abundance. Taylor then shared some of what came to mind for him.
- He then shifted to focusing on the question "what did God bring us through for (not "if" anymore)?" His 3 main points were:
 - Loving community;
 - To be formed; and
 - o To be on mission.
- Pastor Taylor then thanked the worship team and Jinny for their roles and support.
- He shared that he wants and intends to be there for the congregation and to be able to talk with and get to know everyone.

Kids' Ministry Team (Gretchen Stroner and Alison Tealdi)

- Alison shared a review of all that took place in kids' ministry in 2022, including events that took place and other items that were accomplished.
- Gretchen shared future plans and hopes the team has for kids' ministry in 2023.

Pastor Rick Fisk (read by Dave Green)

- Dave Green read highlights from Pastor Rick's report.
- Pastor Rick wears many hats at DeerGrove, including Pastoral care, life groups, preaching, grief group, adult CF, and committee work.

Pastor Peter Sjoblom (read by Lorin)

• Lorin read some of the highlights from Pastor Peter's letter to the congregation.

Prayer for Staff

• Dave Green prayed for the staff.

Stewardship

Financial Report (Mike Tealdi)

- Mike shared 2022 Financial Results:
 - DeerGrove finished the year \$80,186 above budget.
 - Total giving was \$31,074 higher than last year.
 - Giving in December was \$12,670 higher than November to close out 2022.
 - Income exceeded expenses every month since the last annual meeting.
 - Cash reserves were up by \$62,985 from December 2021 and up \$82,630 from our lowest point in November 2021.
 - Total unrestricted reserves were currently at \$106,748 (as of 12/31/22).
 - A question was asked about how much of our income could have been from one time gifts.
 The finance team shared that while it is hard to know for sure, the fact that there were some large one-time gifts is accounted for in the new proposed budget.
 - A question was asked about the timeframe of the reduction in mortgage payments. The payments will be increasing by \$500 for 6 months and then reassessed.

Budget for 2023 (Dan Palmquist)

- Dan shared that compared to 2022, there are more known factors for 2023.
- When budgeting giving, because of one time gifts that came in earlier in the year, the team looked at giving from September, October and November and used that average (\$21,500) to budget for yearly giving.
- A question was asked about what is included in spiritual growth and nurture. This includes children's ministry, lead pastor ministry account, music, website, serve, hospitality table, etc.
- A question was asked regarding bank fees. This includes Quickbooks and the monthly fee for online giving.
- A question was asked regarding budgeting for properties and what projects does this include? This includes priorities involving the inside of the church including cleaning/visual updates. This could also include parking lot repairs/maintenance.
- A question was asked about budgeting for youth ministry and are we thinking ahead to when we may have more students? Pastor Taylor responded that the youth ministry budget includes special events, confirmation, serving students we have and the age groups we have.
- A comment was made regarding the 10% that goes to the ECC. It was noted that not all churches do this and that DeerGrove also gives to missionaries.

	 Dan shared that there is a change in the percentages this year: In the past, 8% went to the ECC and 2% went to the Central Conference. This year 6.5% will go to the ECC and 3.5% to the Central Conference. 2023 Budget Vote A motion was made to approve the 2023 budget. The motion was seconded and then approved by the congregation. Prayer for Finance Team Mark Johnson prayed for the finance team. 	
Nominating Committee	Ann Johnson presented an update from the Nominating Committee: On the ballot for Leadership Team: Lorin Michael - 1 additional year Mark Johnson - 2nd 2 year term Kristie Bizeau - 2 year term On the ballot for Nominating Committee; Linda Smith - 2 year term Donna Michael - 2 year term Kyle Stroner (LT representative) Pastoral Relations Committee Mark De La Paz (LT representative) A motion was made for one vote to approve all of the proposed new LT and Nominating Committee members. This was seconded, and the new leaders were approved by the congregation. Prayer for new leaders: Kyle Stroner prayed for the new leaders.	
Thank Yous Gather 2023	 Lorin thanked Jen Killinger for serving on the Leadership Team the past two years and being secretary the last year. He also thanked Byron for his years as Chair of the Leadership Team during especially challenging times. Lorin thanked Ann Johnson for her time and dedication as chair of the Nominating Committee. Lorin shared about the Covenant's Annual Meeting, Gather 	
Gather 2023	2023, which will be from June 28-July 1 in Orange County, CA. Two members of DeerGrove can go as delegates, and the budget covers the registration fee for those two members.	
Other Business	 Welcome and Outreach Team (Jinny) Jinny shared that the team includes herself, Judy, Brenda, Kait and Pastor Rick Fisk. The team welcomes ideas and/or other individuals who would like to join. Small group lunches will take place later this month. The Feed My Starving Children serving event will be on March 18th. 	

	 The Global 6K will be re-energized this year and will take place at the church on May 20th. The Palatine Jaycees organize the 4th of July Hometown Fest. DeerGrove will have a booth at the business expo during that weekend, with 2 hour shifts during which church members/attenders may volunteer. 	
	Question about Shared Contracts • There was a question about an update on the shared contracts with other businesses/groups. ○ Tricon update: the plowing is going well, but they still have not signed the new contract. ○ The Practice: sharing office space is going well. Happy New Year! We are grateful to the Lord for each of the pastors, congregations, and many ministries of the Central Conference. Please know that we are praying for the 110 churches, over 300 ministers, and the movement of the Holy Spirit in the Central Conference.

We are gearing up to move forward in ministry in 2024. How do we do this? The Church is called to seek the lost, to empower the weak, to care for the sick, to disciple the believer, and to challenge the status quo. We continue to do this, while we also strive to plant churches, help strengthen current churches, walk with ministers, and continue to provide guidance to our conference ministries. We can only do this with your faithful partnership and contribution.

Paul, in Philippians 1:6, reminds us that we are in this together. "Because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

Post-pandemic, churches are creating their new normal and growing comfortable once again in the mission of the church, to gather those who need the hope of Jesus Christ. This is the perfect time to "move mission forward" together, as this continues to be our theme for this year.

Church plants in our conference are also continuing to move forward in mission after the pandemic. We are seeing the movement of the Holy Spirit through the many people coming to Christ. These new believers are being baptized and joining the church to grow spiritually in community.

Things we accomplished together in 2023:

- In 2023, the Central Conference staff helped over 70 local Covenant pastors obtain their Evangelical Covenant Church (ECC) credentials.
- We also walked alongside six Covenant ministers from our conference as they went through the ECC ordination process. These local ministers were ordained at the Covenant Annual Meeting (Gather).
- We continue to walk with churches in the Central Conference that are seeking interim / transition pastors and we offer coaching to these pastors as they step into these roles.
- The conference staff assisted four churches in 2023 with finding interim and transitional pastors. The staff is currently assisting two other churches with finding interim and transitional pastors.
- Currently there are eight Central Conference churches seeking lead pastors. The conference staff is walking alongside these churches' pastoral search committees. Ten churches completed their search process in 2023 and have called new lead pastors.
- We continue to walk alongside three church plants, with the possibility of adding two church plants in our conference in 2024.
- We are checking in with our Covenant ministers on a regular basis. In 2023, the conference staff did more than 60 care check-ins with local Covenant ministers.

- We assist local churches as they look for information and resources that develop their ministries. This includes the pHCheck, which is a church assessment tool, as well as, Vitality workshops, Leadership Team discernment, and Living Legacy coaching. The conference staff is available to answer any questions you have about resources for your local church.
- Rev. Jill Lind concluded her time with our conference, and we are so grateful for her commitment to care for ministers and lay leaders. Rev. Nicole McClurg is now walking with our ministers.
- The Central Conference staff is just an email or phone call away. Feel free to contact the Central Conference office at info@centralconf.org or at 773-267-3060.

This year, the Central Conference is planning to hold the conference annual gathering, Celebration 2024, as an in-person event, until we are told otherwise. Please save the dates: Thursday, May 2 – Saturday, May 4, 2024, at Batavia Covenant Church, in Batavia, IL. We hope Covenant church members can make it to this very special event. We will gather to do Central Conference business, moving mission forward in our conference. More details will be sent to your church shortly, but you may also visit our website at www.centralconf.org/celebration for updates. At Celebration 2024 we are committed to sharing the good news coming from local Covenant churches in our conference. Great ministry is happening all around the Central Conference!

Please know that we cannot do ministry without your prayers and financial partnership. We are empowered by the local Covenant churches in our conference to move mission forward. However, we cannot continue to plant, strengthen, and connect churches without your support. We come together and pray over the local needs of our church, our community, our denomination, our missionaries, and our world. 

Notable points from 2023:

- Largest attendance was 85 for the Christmas Program

Report to the Annual Meeting Taylor Sexton: Lead Pastor February 4th, 2024

Philippians 1:3-6

3 I thank my God every time I remember you. 4 In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, 6 being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

The Apostle Paul's words to the Philippians perfectly summarizes my own thoughts about DeerGrove Covenant Church. This first year in the role of lead pastor has been such a joy and honor. I am so gratefully to partner with each of you as we seek to follow the Holy Spirit's leading for the church and our own lives.

If I could summarize my first year as lead pastor in one word it would be, 'grateful.' I am grateful to God for carrying on the good work He began in DeerGrove 29 years ago. I am grateful that God continues to use this community to build up one another in Christ, to grow deeper in faith through the study of the Word and community worship, and to shine the light of Christ to our community. I wholeheartedly believe that together we have lived into Jesus's call to let our light shine before others so that they may see and glorify God. (Mt. 5:16) Finally, I am grateful for the countless ways so many of you use your unique giftings to serve DeerGrove steadfastly. Your spirits of service and generosity continually point me to the goodness of Jesus. Thank you.

Key Areas of Leadership:

Preaching: We continued to follow the Revised Common Lectionary in 2023. I trust that consistently following the lectionary guides us well through the breadth of Scripture, both the Old and New Testaments. In 2023 we had a strong focus on the key events of the life of Jesus and what they mean for us. We also spent time in the parables of Jesus focusing on how Jesus used parables to bring us to a deeper level of faith and commitment to God. One of the unique gifts of 2023 was the wide range of speakers we were able to welcome. In total we heard from 10 different voices this year. This diversity of voices brought us unique perspectives and new insights into God's Word. It has also been a gift to hear consistently from three of our lay-leaders, Bridget Jeffries, Mark De La Paz, and Rev. Dave Green.

Corporate Worship Planning: We continue to be blessed by our volunteers that serve on worship team. Their commitment to leading well and using their gifts to invite us all into the presence God each week is truly a gift. In 2023 the worship team remained committed to being led by the spirit in both song selection and leading community worship. One of the goals of 2023 was to solidify a strong repertoire of familiar songs, while also introducing current worship songs people might hear online or on the radio. Another goal was to make sure the worship was engaging and welcoming to our entire community through embracing both contemporary and traditional worship elements. We continued the rhythm of having an intergenerational Sunday

on the second Sunday of each month. These Sundays were marked by upbeat worship the kids could play along to as well as powerful and engaging children's messages given primarily by Brenda Welker. (Thank you, Brenda!) Another gift of 2023 was our continued practice of Sabbath on the fifth Sundays. These Sundays have become an important piece of our identity as a church community where we worship God through prayer, resting, and building stronger bonds with one another. The fifth Sunday's are a great vision of the family of God.

Leadership Team: It has been my honor and pleasure serving with this leadership team. Each member has stepped up in big ways to help guide DeerGrove to a very bright future. Each month we prayerfully considered both mundane and important decisions for the life of the church seeking God's guidance every step of the way. Since I will be able to attend this year's annual meeting my report will be shorter; covering general comments and brief updates within my areas of responsibility.

Comments:

This has been a great year for DeerGrove with Pastor Taylor Sexton serving as our lead pastor. I believe his preaching and leadership have greatly benefitted DeerGrove. As a staff member, I have appreciated the opportunity to work closely with Pastor Taylor this year.

We have adapted well to being a bi-vocational church. One of the needed distinctives is high and quality volunteerism and I think we have exceeded expectations in this area, my thanks to each of you who has assumed responsibility as a volunteer, well done!

Proof of both above comments can be seen in increased attendance and in dedicated generosity in meeting the financial needs of DeerGrove. To God be the glory.

Areas of Responsibility:

Congregational Care covers mostly meeting the needs of individuals needing an ear to listen or someone to pray for/with them. These areas have covered health issues, dealing with grief, relationship issues, work concerns, depression, and related topics. Often it is simply coffee or a meal and finding out how someone is doing, encouragement.

Life Groups (Small Groups) have been thriving this year. We launched a small group targeted toward seekers (thanks Jeff & Lee). We reorganized the men's group which now meets on Saturday mornings (thanks John). We have joined together the former Flock and Herd groups which has resulted in new life and

vitality for attendees from both former groups (thanks to Judy for her leadership in providing the needed structure and communication). We hope to soon have a new name for the group. A monthly (Tuesday) group for young women has been meeting at the church (thanks to Kara for her initiative and leadership). In addition to these group changes; the women's SRT group, informal meetings of the young families have continued random Sundays after church, and adult Christian formation meets Sunday mornings. Thanks to all who attend these meetings and to those who offer leadership to them.

Adult Christian Formation has undergone some significant changes with the addition of Mark and Bridget as discussion leaders. The offering of varied topics, as well as schooled and interesting voices to lead, has attracted some new attendees. It has personally been fun and invigorating to be able to assist Mark and Bridget as they have broadened their skill sets into the area of teaching. I will also continue to share in leading the group, but it is also awarding to have a chance to sit in the class as a participant.

Committee Work is sort of a staple for a staff position. I am no longer attending Leadership Team meetings nor serving on any transition or search committees. I do continue to be the staff liaison for the Welcome Team and serve on the nominating committee. I enjoy attending weekly staff meetings where Pastor Taylor and I discuss all aspects of the functioning of DeerGrove. In addition, we coordinate our individual responsibilities and regularly pray for our congregation's needs. I regularly attend three of the small group functions.

Closing Thoughts: Ask anyone who regularly preaches about how rigorous the preparation is and how draining the delivery of a message can be. For those reasons, as other preachers have become available, I have requested that they be given preference in preaching assignments. I appreciate that Pastor Taylor keeps me involved but have also appreciated that I am not in a regular rotation. I still love to periodically share the Word with God's people. Thanks for being a receptive group and for your encouragement.

Over the last two years one of the hidden forces in our church has been the Tuesday evening prayer time. My thanks to Lorin for seeing the need and engaging

the opportunity. I have personally been blest by this discipline. To those of you who have attended on Tuesdays, and for those of you who have faithfully prayed for DeerGrove from your private places of prayer, thank you. This is perhaps the most important thing that DeerGrove has undertaken.
